

Picket Post Team Captain Rules

In order to be given permission to organize a team out of the Picket Post Swim and Tennis Club, the following rules must be followed:

Any person who wishes to be a Captain must be a Club member and purchase a key to the tennis courts. The team members may, of course, reimburse the Captain for any monetary outlays or expenses if they agree, as a group, to do so.

Each Captain is responsible for opening the tennis and lavatory facilities, and relocking them at the end of their team's practice or match. A team representative (designated by the Captain) or the Captain should arrive with a key, 30 minutes prior to the scheduled match time, to accommodate match players from both Picket Post and the visiting team.

During the team's season, Captains are responsible for emptying the court trash cans and providing for the sweeping of the Har-Tru courts at the conclusion of their team's practice or match. Captains may assign players to perform these duties on a rotational basis or they may agree to perform the functions themselves. They MAY NOT assign the duty to a designee on the basis of match performance or as a form of punishment/penalty.

Each Captain must submit a list of team members to the director of racquet sports.

Each Captain is responsible for notifying team members in a timely manner (via phone, message, or email) of changes to practice or match schedules including changes due to inclement weather, or court availability.

Each Captain is responsible for reporting results to the appropriate recording body and to the Director of Racquet Sports.

Each Captain assumes the responsibility of representing Picket Post in a friendly and hospitable manner and ensures like behavior from team members. Team Captains will report misconduct to the Director of Racquet Sports and to league officials if necessary or appropriate.

Team practice dates and matches should be submitted to the Director of Racquet Sports (or their designee) prior to the team's first match.

Team Captains should conduct an exit interview with the Director of Racquet Sports at the conclusion of the season to report on what worked, what didn't work, and what needs to be done moving forward so that Picket Post can field competitive teams in the proper leagues at the proper levels in subsequent seasons.

Each team captain is required to meet with the Director of Racquet Sports (or their designee) and review the "Picket Post Team Captain Rules" document prior to receiving permission to use the courts.

All team members must be members of Picket Post Swim and Tennis Club.

All rules must be followed throughout the season.

Picket Post board can deny access to the facilities to any captain in non compliance of the above rules.
